WHEREAS, the Port Commission of the Port of Silverdale has met and considered (Name of the taxing district)

BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the taxing district that an increase in the regular property tax levy
is hereby authorized for the levy to be collected in the 2007 tax year. (Year of Collection)
The dollar amount of the increase over the actual levy amount from the previous year shall be \$ 4336.00
which is a percentage increase of% from the previous year. This increase is exclusive of (Percentage increase)
additional revenue resulting from new construction, improvements to property, newly constructed wind turbines,
any increase in the value of state assessed property, any annexations that have occurred and refunds made.

ADOPTED by the Port Commission of the Port of Silverdale, Kitsap County, Washington at a regular open public meeting thereof held on the 16th day of November 2006.



WHEREAS, such needful regulations may be adopted through an ordinance or resolution of the County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Port Commission of the Port of that the Kitsap County Board of County Commissioners be requested to adopt the proposed ORDINANCE ENACTING HEALTH AND WELFARE REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO KITSAP COUNTY PORT DISTRICT PROPERTIES attached hereto as EXHIBIT "A."

PROPOSED ORDINANCE ENACTING HEALTH AND WELFARE REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO KITSAP COUNTY PORT DISTRICT PROPERTIES

Section 1. Definitions

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- (A). "Cruise" is movement of a vessel for purposes other than an authorized use of a Port District facility for moorage of the vessel, entering or leaving a moorage position, fueling, or sewage pumpout.
- (B). "Moorage facility" means any Port District property capable for use for the moorage or storage of vessels. [See RCW 53.08.310(3)]
- (C). "Port District" means each port district established under Title 53 RCW and located within Kitsap County, which has adopted a resolution requesting that the provisions of this Chapter be adopted as part of the ordinances of Kitsap County (or by the city of Bremerton, Port Orchard or Poulsbo), and specifically includes the Port Districts of Bremerton, Brownsville, Eglon, Illahee, Indianola, Keyport, Manchester, Poulsbo, Silverdale, Tracyton, and Waterman.
- (D). "Port District facility" or "Port District property" means property owned or operated by a Port District within Kitsap County.
- (E). "Vessel" means every species of watercraft or other artificial contrivance capable of being used as a means of transportation on water and which does not exceed two hundred feet in length "Vessel" includes any trailer used for the transportation of watercraft. [See RCW 53.08.310(2)]
- (F). "Moorage Area" is that area provided by a Port District for moorage of vessels.

Section 2. Applicability

Unless otherwise provided in this ordinance, this chapter applies to all Port District property.

Section 3. Sewage and Bilge

It is unlawful for any person to discharge sewage or contaminated bilge water in any manner from any vessel while at a Port District moorage facility, unless properly using a designated sewage pumpout facility provided for such purpose.

Section 4. Garbage and trash.

It is unlawful for any person to dispose of garbage, refuse or trash ("garbage") on Port District property unless it comes from a vessel moored or launched at the Port District property or is a container whose contents were consumed on Port District property; or to dispose of such garbage in any manner other than by carefully placing it in containers provided for that purpose. It is unlawful for unauthorized persons to remove the containers from the garbage container area.

Section 5. Smoking.

It is unlawful to smoke in areas posted as nonsmoking on docks, piers, and public areas on Port District property; provided, however, this should not be construed as allowing smoking in non-posted areas where smoking is otherwise prohibited.

Section 6. Swimming and water skiing.

It is unlawful to dive or jump into the water for recreational purposes or to swim in any area posted as "no swimming" by a Port District. It is unlawful to water ski in any area posted as "no water skiing" by a Port District.

Section 7. Fishing.

It is unlawful to fish in or from any Port District property posted as "no fishing."

Section 8. Use of Facilities After Dark.

It is unlawful for any unauthorized person to be on the pier or dock of a Port District facility between sundown and sunrise or as otherwise posted by a Port District.

Section 9. Unattended Children.

It is unlawful for a child under the age of fourteen years to be on a dock or pier unless accompanied by a responsible adult; provided, however, if a lower age limit is adopted by the Port District and posted at the Port District facility, then such lower age limit shall apply.

Section 10. Cruising in moorage area.

It is unlawful to cruise any vessel within a Port District moorage area.

Section 11. Vessel Speed.

It is unlawful to operate a vessel within a Port District moorage area in excess of a posted speed limit, or to leave a wake in the absence of a posted speed limit.

Section 12. Overnight Parking.

It is unlawful to park a motor vehicle or trailer overnight on Port District property except as authorized by the Port District.

Section 13. Daytime Parking.

It is unlawful to park a motor vehicle or trailer outside of a designated parking area within Port District property, or to park within a designated parking area in excess of the posted time limits or time limitations.

Section 14. Animal control and pet waste.

All pets on Port District property must be contained or on leash unless otherwise posted, and all pet waste must be picked up and properly disposed of in a waste receptacle.

Section 15. Cooking on docks or piers.

It is unlawful to cook with open flame upon any dock or pier of a Port District, except in designated areas that are posted to specifically allow cooking with open flame.

Section 16. Fireworks.

It is unlawful to light fireworks on Port District property, except in areas and at times posted.

Section 17. Outdoor fires.

It is unlawful to build or light a fire upon Port District property except in areas and under conditions posted.

Section 18. Alcohol consumption.

It is unlawful to consume alcohol on Port District property in violation of any posted prohibition thereof.

Section 19. Vehicle operation.

It is unlawful to operate a vehicle on Port District property in a dangerous or reckless manner, or to drive at speeds in excess of a posted speed limit, or in excess of five mile per hour where another speed limit is not posted.

Section 20. Boat rafting.

It is unlawful to raft boats (tie boats together while moored) at a Port District moorage facility in violation of posted rules related to such rafting.

Section 21. Feeding wildlife.

It is unlawful to feed wildlife on Port District property in violation of posted rules.

Section 22. Prohibited areas.

It is unlawful for unauthorized persons to be on a Port Property area posted as "no trespassing" or not for public use.

Section 23. Wheeled Recreational Vehicles.

It is unlawful to ride bicycles, skates, skateboards, or other wheeled recreational vehicles on a Port District dock or pier, or on any other Port District property where specifically posted as prohibited.

Section 24. Commercial Use of Port Property.

It is unlawful to engage in commercial activity on Port District property without prior written permission of the Port District.

Section 25. Violation - Penalty.

Except as otherwise provided, violation of any provision of this chapter is a misdemeanor, punishable as provided in Section 1.12.010 of the Kitsap County Code. Provided, however, a violation of provisions relating to traffic, including parking, standing, stopping, and pedestrian is a traffic infraction, unless such provision is the equivalent to that in Title 46, Revised Code of Washington (RCW) set forth in RCW 46.63.020, which remains a misdemeanor.

Section 26. Severability.

If any provision of this ordinance, or its application to any person, entity or circumstance is for any reason held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance, or the application of the provision of the provision to other persons, entities or circumstances is not affected.

Section 27. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
